







Micro-Paper 57: Personal Learning Environment



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Defining the Term

A personal learning environment, or PLE, is a customized environment designed by a learner with the intention of enhancing the learning processes. Learners can construct PLEs with any kind of tool. What matters in crafting a PLE is to personalize it based on the learning necessities of a specific learner. Each person has different learning preferences. Some learn through visual modalities, others through listening and others through reading. Having these preferences in mind the learner should build an environment that has tools designed to appeal to his needs.

Technological environments are very important to develop PLEs, as these offer different <u>multimodal</u> tools and websites in which the students can also feel motivated to work with. Learners should first make a self-assessment in order to understand their own learning processes.
